# Assessment (Closing Task):

#### Personal objective:

- Over-do conducting (dynamics, cues)

understanding.

#### **Procedure:**

• Change seating

- Have students mix themselves up within the ensemble, sitting by others NOT in their same section
- Read "Blessed Are They"
  - Focus on applying their ear to the instrumentation around them.
    - "What sounds compare to yours?"
    - "What sounds differ from yours?"
    - "Putting more focus will extend the use of your ear to construct a better balance as a whole. Let's play the \_\_\_\_\_ at m. \_\_\_\_\_, hold it out, and close your eyes. Just listen to your surroundings."

# Extensions (optional):

- Incorporate different activities:
  - Mixing up seating:
    - Sections sit together
    - Woodwinds and brass switch
    - Circles: one big one, section circles, mixed circles
  - Sing parts (w/ recording to audibly relate to live piece)
    - Vowels: "Ah" with jaw down, "Oh" with lips rolled in, "Oo" with lips rolled out
    - Tongue placements
